From Pastor Andrew Rogness

THE BIG PICTURE

An artist working on a canvas moves back and forth. The movement is in close with detailed strokes of the brush, and then back a step or more to gain perspective on the whole picture being created. If the net effect of the detailed work doesn't achieve the overall result desired, then the detail needs to change. If the artist never steps back to see the whole picture, the outcome of the artwork is haphazard.

Each of us is an artist, creating our life's picture with the detail of each day. Those details have a way of consuming our lives such that, if we ever pause to reflect on it, we might wonder what we've been doing with our lives or if there's any cohesion to the whole. Taking a step back to consider the big picture is an important habit for a life's portrait.

One begins with a picture in mind. I once participated in a retreat where each participant was given a simple assignment: write an epitaph that you hope could be said of you at your funeral. While a little morose, the exercise encouraged us each to imagine what we wished the sum of our life to be. It would be possible, however, to have a narrow vision – figure out 5 life goals that can be funded with a credit card, and leave it at that. But our faith expands our vision to greater perspectives.

God wants us to be bold in imagining the picture we paint. And why not? Created in God's image, God knows we each have the stuff to make a great picture with the canvas and paints given each one. Jesus took an impetuous fisherman – an unlikely candidate – and told him, "Upon you I will build my church." Who would have thought it possible, looking at the material at hand? Jesus added to the scope of the picture with his last encounter: "Peter, do you love me? Feed my sheep." Christ's church on earth is a continued legacy of this great vision. And if Christ can work with the raw material that was Peter, he can work with any one of us!

As we gather for worship, we renew a sense of the big picture that we strive to paint. Remembering the Sabbath to keep it holy is also a way we keep ourselves holy – that is, set apart for God's work in the world. As we worship we take a step back from the detailed strokes of our daily life and make sure the details are adding to the beauty of the whole. Then, with some confidence, we can step back into the swift pace of Monday through Saturday to be holy in painting our canvas.

Collectively Prince of Peace engages in the same process – renewing vision and mission and values, and applying them to the detail of our daily work together. We have been painting this canvas for fifty years. We step back to give thanks for the beauty of what has been done, to ground ourselves in God, and then step forward to add to the portrait.

May God's grace flow richly in us for what will emerge.

- Budget year is the same as the program year.
- Permits staff to budget during the spring/summer months when program visioning for the next program year is being completed.
- Places the budget process during a typically slower period in the church year.
- Places high income months into the middle of the fiscal period rather than at the end, permitting better planning in response to income projections.

Thoughts from Audrey

With warm weather like today, many of us are shifting our planning to summer. This is true for our young people. School will soon be over. Graduation will be a memory. Summer plans will no longer be plans, but life. Summer is the time of year that transitions are common. Some of these will be welcome, some will not be. Our young people will use this summer to begin the changes for fall—a new grade, new school, new friends, and plans for ongoing life.

It is this time of year that we celebrate Jesus' Ascension. On Sunday, the text for the day is what we call the "High Priestly Prayer." This is the prayer that Jesus prays shortly before he ascends to the Father. He prays for his disciples, "The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one. I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me." Jesus could not have given them a greater gift—his prayer for them. 

Tanzania Update

Severe crop failure in Africa is usually local. One area may have excellent crops while only forty miles away there may be no harvest at all. This happened last year in the Iringa region. In some areas there were bumper crops while in others the harvest was between 0% and 20% of normal. This year's harvest has not yet begun. Some families have gone to **having one meal of ugali** (the staple food made of ground corn and water) **every other day or every third day.**

The Saint Paul Area Synod sent a letter in December to congregations and leaders inviting donations. Over \$60,000 has been given. This has allowed for the purchase and distribution of around **720,000 lbs of corn.**

This year there has been an abundance of rain, so the prospect for good crops is better. There are, however, some areas where the abundant rains have flooded and destroyed their crops, so they have **another 14 months to go before there may be a harvest.**

- Current: Jan – Dec, Christmas income is at the end of the cycle. We rely on projections to compensate for our slower summer months, with little opportunity to make any corrections prior to the end of the period.
- Proposed: July – June. Both Christmas and Easter income is received at mid-points throughout the year, allowing a better response to actual income rather than budgeted/projected.
- Provides for two year-end stewardship emphasis periods, the typical calendar (tax) year end and another fiscal year end, conveniently spaced six months apart.
- Contribution year will remain January – December.

St. Paul Area Women's Convention Update

The St. Paul Area Women's Convention was at Faith Lutheran Church in Forest Lake April 13 and 14.

Judy Florine was our delegate. Many of the women from Prince of Peace participated by:

CLEAN UP AND DISPOSAL OF COMPACT FLUORESCENT BULBS (CFL)

CFLs contain a very small amount of mercury sealed within the glass tubing - an average of 5 milligrams. By comparison, older home thermometers contain 500 milligrams of mercury and many manual thermostats contain up to 3000 milligrams. Engineers are continually working on bulbs that use even less mercury. Research indicates that there is no immediate health risk to you or your family should a bulb break and it's cleaned up properly. You can minimize any risks by following these proper clean-up and disposal guidelines:

- * Sweep up (don't vacuum) all of the glass fragments and fine particles.
- * Place broken pieces in a sealed plastic bag and wipe the area with a damp paper towel to pick up any stray shards of glass or fine particles. Put the used towel in the plastic bag as well.
- * If weather permits, open windows to allow the room to ventilate.

Bulbs should be taken to a disposal site or store. Ask where you buy the bulbs if they are a disposal site. Ramsey County is free but others have a cost. Call for cost.
