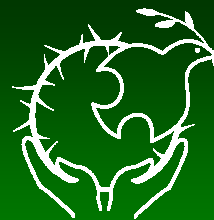

Message from Pastor Gary Olson

Dear Prince of Peace and fellow members,
In the spirit of keeping you informed about our ministry it is important that I share the following letter I sent recently to the Personnel Committee.

Dear Personnel Committee:

This message is written for two purposes.

First to inform you that I am not putting my name in as a candidate for the interim associate pastor call at Prince of Peace. I am assuming, of course, that you will decide you want to call an interim. Hopefully that is not presumptuous.

Second to let you know that I am ending my work as temporary half-time pastor on May 16, 2010.

It is a pleasure to work with Lead Pastor Anita and I am appreciative of the pastoral ministry you and Anita are giving me the opportunity to do among you. There are so many fine people here and I appreciate getting to know you in this temporary pastoral way. It feels good to be helpful and to fill-in for Pastor Andrew during this difficult time.

While none of us knows the future, I took to heart Bishop Rogness' insightful comment that the longer I serve as pastor, building pastoral relationships, the less likely it would be that I could continue as a member here when my pastoral work is concluded.

It's best, I think, for Prince of Peace to move ahead and shape a longer term pastoral staff.

Message from Pastor Anita Beste

Now the green blade rises ...

Today Les Wachter and I walked outside the church to marvel at a mere three inches of green daffodil growth pushing up through the black dirt. Such signs of new growth and new life compel us to delight in the rhythm of the seasons and the gifts of spring after the cold and spareness of winter.

Flowers on the south side of the building are just one of the many changes we've made to our church building. It's been a long process – starting from our initial planning in 2004. And there were a few bumps in the road and changes along the way – like switching from plans to build a new sanctuary space to renewing our current one. But now, we are in a time and place to celebrate the many improvements made and take pleasure in the space where we gather for worship. So I invite you to come, celebrate, and be a part of the Building Dedication during worship on Sunday, April 11.

There was purpose and values – even theology – behind the changes we made. I want to lift up just a few of them and what they say about us:

- Welcome and Hospitality – with the expanded narthex and entrance, and the flexible arrangement of chairs to suggest community;
- Witness – with the crosses in the windows and the cross atop the roof proclaiming this building and its people as a church;
- Mission and Ministry – with the scripture verse that greets everyone coming through the main entrance as they look up to read *Do justice. Love kindness. Walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8*
- Music – with flexible space for the bells, a safe floor for the choir, and needed maintenance for the organ;
- Progressive – with new technology like the projection system adding a new dimension to our worship together;
- Beauty – with the light from the east windows; new pulpit and font; new table and paraments, and those beautiful flowers growing on the south side.

We celebrate these changes in our building even as we wonder about other changes in our congregation – first the retirement of Pastor Andrew following his illness and then Pastor Gary's temporary, but steadfast, pastoral presence with us coming to an end in May. But in this Easter season when we celebrate the gift of new life in Jesus we remember God's presence and power to always be stirring up new life and new growth.

And in faith, we know and sing –

*Now the green blade rises from the buried grain,
wheat that in dark earth many days has lain;
love lives again, that with the dead has been;
love is come again like wheat arising green.*

*When our hearts are wintry, grieving or in pain,
Your touch can call us back to life again,
Fields of our hearts that dead and bare have been;
Love is come again like wheat arising green.*

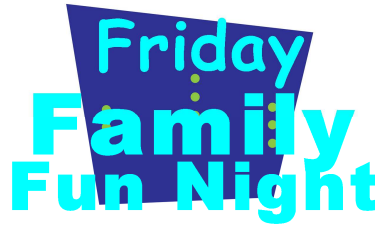
