Council Corner—Bonita Eliason

We drove our son Jeff to his new home in Massachusetts this fall. At Concordia College Jeff experienced overlapping communities of faculty, students, and musicians that made his experience there both rewarding and fun. Now at graduate school he must find community in a different place. I had ample time on the drive back to Minnesota to ponder the Prince of Peace community, and my own values and understandings related to community. What characteristics do I value in the communities that I choose as my own? One is shared interests - and music is one interest I share with many in the Prince of Peace community. The opportunity to participate as a singer, bell ringer and listener has enriched my life, and binds me to the community. A second shared interest is to better understand what it means to be a Christian, and how to live in accordance with my beliefs. Worship and education opportunities at Prince of Peace help satisfy this interest.

Through my participation in the church council, I've come to appreciate the importance of another aspect of community: clearly articulated governance policies (yes, really!). One of the ironies of the human experience is that although we are social animals, who both seek and benefit from community, we often have trouble finding a path we can all peacefully travel together. There are many reasons for this. We are, after all, individuals, and there is never be a perfect match between each individual's interests and desires, and those of the community as a whole. We can also be very passionate advocates for our own point of view. Clearly defined governance documents such as the constitution and by-laws are a crucial reference and anchor that help guide us as we make decisions about our community life.

Balancing the interests of individuals with the interest of the community can be particularly challenging in times of transition. A characteristic of community that is crucial to finding this balance is good will. An abundance of good will is evident at Prince of Peace in

Message from Senior Pastor Anita Beste

Sharing in the Gospel – And Giving Thanks!

I thank my God every time I remember you ... because of your sharing in the gospel Philippians 1:3-6

The apostle Paul was always writing letters to the various Christian congregations that developed those first years after Jesus. He wrote to encourage them in this new faith and following of Jesus that they were living into. He wrote to address theological questions that had come up, or a problem in how they should live together in community. He wrote to ask for an offering to be taken up in support of the ministry that they shared. He wrote letters to stay connected. Many of the books of the New Testament are epistles – letters to congregations in places like Galatia, Philippi and Rome. Paul began each letter by giving thanks to God for them. I would like to do the same. I begin this Vine article – and this month of November where we pay special attention to giving thanks – by giving thanks to God for you – the people of this congregation.

I give thanks for the way God's Spirit moves in our lives –

- To draw us into the mystery and majesty of God;
- To draw us into community and congregational life with one another
- To draw us into mission and ministry for the sake of God's reign – God's will on earth as it is in heaven

I give thanks to God for your sharing in the gospel. I can read the Bible by myself, but I get more out of it when I read it in community with you. I can praise God by myself, but I make a more joyful noise when we do it together. I can strive for justice for God's people by myself, but I'm more hopeful, and more effective, when we strive together.

And so, every November, we, as members of a congregation, commit to our life together. We ask members to 1) renew their membership at Prince of Peace, and 2) make and estimate of giving in monetary support for the work and joy of our sharing in the gospel. It is a way of giving thanks to God -- for the gift of the gospel in Jesus Christ and for the community that we share in his name.

As we commit to being a member of this part of the body of Christ called Prince of Peace in Roseville, we commit to the joy and work of sharing in the gospel – together. As we commit money in support of our work and life together, we commit to the joy and work of sharing in the gospel – together. Thanks be to God!

I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing in the gospel from the first day until now. I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ.

Message from Pastor Gordon Peterson



On Vitality: *One in Mission and Transition*

Many of you know my name. You know that I am a Lutheran pastor serving as your Interim Pastor for Transition (read Transformation) and Mission. Many of you know that I'm married to Cathie. Some of you know that we have two daughters, one son-in-law and one granddaughter (yeah!). A few of you know that I'm of Scandinavian heritage with a sprinkling of German (uff da - meine liebe). This information helps you to begin to know me. There are, of course, many other things that give definition to my life just as there are many factors that define who you are. For example, if I really want to know you and you want to know me, it would be important for us to know what matters to each other.

What often matters most, along with our relationships, are the ideas, the issues, the concerns, hopes, the dreams and the details of our life that further define who I am and who you are. What "matters" provides a framework of purposefulness.

I believe this is, also, true for churches, including congregations like Prince of Peace Lutheran Church in Roseville, Minnesota. If I want to know Prince of Peace Lutheran Church (and I do!), I need know Prince of Peace in terms of your relationships (family- origin - culture - experience - history) and what you believe truly matters to this congregation. Is it your presence in the community? Is it the wonderful music program? Is it the growing Sunday school? Is it the faithful volunteers? Is it the opportunity that you have to worship our awesome God?

Identity, purpose (what matters) and vision are critical elements in the process of understanding who we are and what God is calling us to become as God's promise people. The elements will help your Transition Team frame their work in the coming days, weeks and months.

In my experience, I've observed that those congregations willing to ask the right questions (Who are we?) and the difficult questions (What matters?) are the congregations with the most vitality. These congregations come in all sizes. Some are very small and others are quite large. Their vitality isn't measured only in their size. Their vitality includes being open to the questions and the possibilities of becoming what God intends for us to be

What do you think God is calling Prince of Peace to "become"? Where do you think God is calling Prince of Peace to be present? Where do you believe God is calling you to follow and to be the presence of Christ in this time and in this place? I would love to know your answer and so would the members of the Transition Team! The Transition Team members are: Janet Brahier, Stephanie Lundorff, Jon Lentsch, Kent Olson, Damien Riehl, Hadley Verwest, and David Weiler. I serve as a resource to the Team (player/coach).





The Lutheran Malaria Initiative

*Every 45 seconds a child dies from Malaria. Malaria is **preventable and treatable**. The time to act is now! Together, through the Lutheran Malaria Initiative, we can restore health and inspire hope for millions of people.*

The 2009 ELCA Churchwide Assembly voted overwhelmingly to begin initial Lutheran Malaria Initiative activities in the ELCA. This initiative is in support of the United Nations Millennium Development goals (Goal #6), established at the onset of this century and to be attained by 2015. The ELCA, the Missouri Synod, and Lutheran World Relief hope to raise \$75 million to reduce deaths in Africa by 2015.

In 2010-11 the ELCA is piloting the Initiative in a number of synods across the country. The Mpls. Area Synod is one of these. In August of 2011, the ELCA Churchwide Assembly will consider an action that would roll out the Lutheran Malaria Initiative to the whole ELCA. The ultimate goal is that every ELCA synod will join the Lutheran Malaria Initiative in the efforts to contain malaria in Africa.
