Message from Pastor Anita Beste



Stability! This is going to be the word for 2012. The word *change* or *transition* appeared many times in this newsletter or my sermons throughout 2010 and 2011, but now the theme is stability—stability in staffing and stability as the foundation for mission and ministry together.

I have a pretty high tolerance for change, and change can be great for mixing things up and letting the fresh air of the Holy Spirit blow through. But stability can be wonderful too, and God willing, that is what I'm praying for in 2012.

However, I am not thinking of stability as something boring or stagnant. I'm thinking of stability as a strong foundation upon which to build. I'm reminded of Jesus' words in the Sermon on the Mount:

"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock. The rain fell, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on rock. And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not act on them will be like a foolish man who built his house on sand. The rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell—and great was its fall!" Matthew 7:24-27

My Lutheran Study Bible gives this passage the heading *Hearers and Doers*. As a community of faith, we hear the words of Jesus as the strong foundation of our faith life together. And from that strong foundation we are compelled to act. We become doers—participating as workers in God's reign of peace and justice through acts of compassion and mercy and love. As people of faith, we are both hearers and doers of the Word of God. As our baptismal liturgy reminds us, this is the mission that we share: to give thanks and praise to God, and to bear God's creative and redeeming word to all the world.

The same creative power and word of God that in the beginning said, "Let there be light," and there was light", is as busy creating today as it was in the beginning. God did not just create in the beginning and then stop. God continues to create today. One of my favorite Bible texts proclaims this power:

*For as the rain and the snow come down from heaven,
and do not return there until they have watered the earth,
making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread
to the eater, so shall my word be that goes out from my mouth;
it shall not return to me empty,
but it shall accomplish that which I purpose,
and succeed in the thing for which I sent it. Isaiah 55:10-11*

For 2012, I pray God builds us up on the strong foundation of God's word—and then sends us out into the world as faithful hearers and doers of that word.


More on Pastor Andrew Lundborg...in his own words

As I'm looking ahead to Epiphany I find myself reflecting on where we've been. The words in the refrain are "We are called to act with justice, we are called to love tenderly; we are called to serve one another, to walk humbly with God."

If we could all live our life with the CALLINGS this song asks us to do, I think we'd all be ENERGIZERS. When entering the church via the entry by the narthex, take time to read the words in the skylight. Do they look familiar? They are calling us to be ENERGIZERS!

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An Update from the Capital Improvement Task Force

In June, the Capital Improvement Task Force presented the congregation with details of a "Replace, Reconstruct & Repair" recommendation delivered to the Council. The urgency of repairing several segments of the roof and related projects led to a vote to obtain a loan for this phase of capital improvement. In September and October, these projects were completed. The major items included:

- reconstruction of roof to correct leaks and divert water more effectively
- replacement of upper sections of gym roof
- replacement of narthex roof and skylights
- replacement of two furnaces in the west wing with one high-efficiency furnace
- installation of air-conditioning to replace window units in daycare and Sunday-school classrooms
- repair of water damage to Youth Office, hallway and Youth Choir

Many other smaller projects were also completed. In October, we reviewed the Phase 2 list and voted with "Bible Bucks" in project category baskets to survey our values to guide funding priorities. These categories included "Furnaces & AC", "Classroom Upgrade", "Program Space Reconfiguration", and other projects. In November and December, cost estimates for the Phase 2 projects were completed. Proposed timelines were added to categorize the projects for 1-year, 3-year, or 5-year implementation. This plan will be presented at the January 8 Adult Forum. With your input, this is an opportunity to help review and update this plan before it is delivered to the Council.
