Pastor Peter: Can you feel the rumble?

Much of our efforts at Prince of Peace over the last six months have involved moving our staffing configuration from concept to reality. Now that the puzzle pieces are falling into place I'm also becoming aware of how my role is changing in the process. The daily work of ministry will soon be sharedwith a number of others, freeing me to live more

fully into the call that I was given here to Prince of Peace. I'm excited for these changes to finally take shape and anticipate a busy fall for all of our shared ministries. It will be great to have a full team of collaborators in place to help plan and lead us forward.

Staff Transitions

- Associate Pastor: After a thorough period of discernment, the call committee forwarded its final recommendation (Reverend Elizabeth Hoium) to the Council, who subsequently voted to forward the recommendation on to the Congregation. The congregation voted to extend a call to Pastor Betsy on August 26. The Personnel Committee has prepared the compensation package and draft call documents to be reviewed by the Bishop's office. In anticipation of a positive outcome and formal 10/1 start date, some preliminary planning is already underway. A date for installation has been set for 10/28. Pastor Betsy is also making herself available prior to her start to participate in some planning to help her hit the ground running in October.
- Visitation/Congregational Care: Pastor Ruth was hired and began her service with us mid-July. With the help of Pastor Lynn and Anne Haugen, she has been oriented to most of our on-going pastoral care and visitation concerns. An office for her use is being prepared on the lower level including a fresh coat of paint and repaired phone service. (Thanks to Tara & the Monday Morning Crew!)
- Youth Director: Cori Forcey, the interview committee (and high school youth's) recommendation accepted the position as offered by the Personnel Committee. She began formally in mid-August and a date for her "commissioning" will be set soon.
- Funeral Coordinator: We have received one candidate application and we are still looking for members to serve on an interview/selection committee. I have met individually with the candidate for a scoping interview and hope to convene the full interview committee shortly.

All will gather together in the sanctuary for the first 15 minutes and then I will lead children and parents off to learn about the changes to our Sunday School format. Rolf will stay behind with those interested in learning more about the history and development of the NL.
- Rally Day will also include some post-worship festivities, including a kidfriendly Ninja Warrior course, pot-luck and activities for participants of all ages. Thanks to the Children's Ministry planning team that's making all the arrangements for this fun kick-off to our fall programming.

As I write this, the parking lot just outside my office window is being removed and prepared for re-surfacing. Though the rumble of heavy machinery is a bit of a distraction, I give thanks for the efforts being made to make our church all the more welcoming in the months and years ahead. I am also grateful to have been able to take some time away this summer

Pastor Ruth: Deeper in God's Story

When I was little my favorite TV show was Reading Rainbow, the PBS show dedicated to children's books. I loved the theme song (I'd be happy to sing it for you), the host, the featured books, and how each episode promised new adventures waiting for me at my local library.

The host, LeVar Burton, would always end his review of a book by saying, "but you don't have to take my word for it." I took this as a personal challenge to read the book and decide for myself whether I agreed with his assessment of the book. There is nothing quite like being able to read a story for yourself to see what images leap into your imagination, noticing what feelings the story conjures up inside of you, and hearing the voices of the characters come alive in your head.

This fall at Prince of Peace we will begin using the Narrative Lectionary as a way of going deeper into God's story in a chronological way. We will be centering ourselves in God's story during worship and educational opportunities, but I will also be using the biblical stories during home visits to further the conversation.

For instance, together we will read the story of the call of Abraham (Gen. 12:1-9) and together notice where we are in God's story; because God's story is our story. The biblical story is something we live into, not just hear about on Sunday mornings.

As God's children we are all invited to share what we see, hear, and feel. When we take the time to dive deeper as a community, we get to hear different perspectives, notice different images, and experience different feelings, knowing that there is a place for us in God's story because everyone of us matters. God's story has the power to shape our life together for good...but you don't have to take my word for it.

Letter from Pastor Elizabeth (Betsy) Hoium

August 4, 2018

To the Prince of Peace Church Council,

Call Committee Chair Jennifer Duncan asked me to write a letter introducing myself to you. I graduated from Luther Seminary in 2012 and have experience in both a large and small congregation. My first call was as the Associate Pastor of Faith Formation at Peace Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls, South Dakota where I served for 4 1/2 years. Peace is a 4,400-member congregation and I was one of four pastors. More recently I have served as a solo pastor at Living Waters Lutheran Church in Lino Lakes. I have passions for worship and preaching, working with children, youth and people of all ages, and outreach ministries.

Children, Youth and Intergenerational Ministry

In each of my roles I have worked with faith formation ministry. During my internship at Redeemer Lutheran Church in White Bear Lake I taught confirmation and worked with volunteers to combine Vacation Bible School and a musical camp the congregation had done to be VBS with a musical.

At Peace I worked with four children, youth and family staff on children's ministry, milestones, service projects, confirmation and high school ministry. We took students to the Boundary Waters Canoe Area and on a mission trip to an Indian Reservation.

A highlight of my time at Living Waters has been working with volunteers to create a new opportunity for children and families called Alive! Worship. "Alive!" stands for All Ages Learning in an Innovative Vibrant Environment. It is a short worship service with a long story time followed by stations that reinforced the story. These often included art, cooking, science, games, service projects and a digging deeper into the story bible study. We had participants from ages 1-80 and often 3 generation families.

As part of Alive! Worship we did Pop Up Christmas and Easter programs. I have been invited to write a chapter of a book and speak at a Cross Gen conference in Colorado about this experience. I have also recently written a portion of Sundays and Seasons worship resource called "Let the Children Come" to make worship accessible to people of all ages.

In confirmation we added a monthly learning project or field trip to help students better understand how we translate faith into daily life. I enjoyed partnering with 5 other congregations for a week-long middle school Summer Stretch program that included service projects, Bible Study and fun activities.

Butreach Ministry

I enjoy both local and global mission opportunities as a way to meet new people and love our neighbors. While at Peace, I served on the board of Lutheran Social Services of South Dakota and Chairs Ministry Partners - a nonprofit of 13 ELCA congregation that ran a mobile food pantry and other outreach ministries. Our largest outreach ministry at Peace was Necessities for Neighbors where we gave away diapers, toilet paper and other items you could not buy with food stamps to 300 people a month. We applied for and received a \$10,000 grant from Thrivent for this ministry, which we

used to begin a new ministry called Church on the Street. At Living Waters we worked with the local food shelf and women's shelter. Our biggest project was collecting warm winter gear for them at Christmas time.

At Peace we had an annual trip to our partner congregation in Haiti. People from high school through retirement age traveled together. I had the opportunity to participate three times, including preaching with a translator. When I was a member of Augustana Lutheran Church in West St. Paul I went on mission trips to Iringa, Tanzania and La Esmeralda, Guatemala and thus am very excited about Prince of Peace's relationship with Tanzania.

Background

Prior to seminary I served as a staff attorney and assistant airport director for the Metropolitan Airports Commission. We did all the behind-the-scenes business negotiations with the airlines, ground transportation, stores and restaurants at Minneapolis-St. Paul Airport. I learned a lot about managing people, projects and budgets. I am often asked how did you go from being a lawyer to a pastor. I had gotten involved in my congregation as an adult leader with high school youth, been on several mission trips and was serving on the church council. The Holy Spirit kept nudging me in that direction. I was also a member of a small group with eight young women and one of our friends was diagnosed with brain cancer. Walking with her through that experience for nearly two years was a big part of my call to ministry.

I grew up in Columbia Heights where my parents still live. I received an associate degree from Cottey College in Missouri and transferred to the U of M where I majored in history and played flute & piccolo in the Minnesota Marching Band. I graduated from the U of M Law School and Luther Seminary. I live in south Minneapolis and enjoy walking, biking, traveling, reading, and cross country skiing.

I have enjoyed getting to know the Call Committee and look forward to partnering with you in ministry.

Rolf on the development of the lectionary.


