- 1. Is a downpayment on purchase of a townhome waived? K
 There is no monetary down payment. Sweat equity is the down
 payment. Sweat equity involves working for a set number of hours on
 a Habitat project (their own or someone elses) and attending several
 classes on home ownership, finances etc.
- Is the monthly mortgage payment based on the income of the buyer?
 K Yes, Habitat mortgage monthly payments are based in household income.
- 3. How many row homes/townhomes are possible on Prince of Peace property? K When Chad was here he mentioned something between 18 and 24 units depending on how many units were associated with each building. And, maybe six buildings.
- 4. How soon could the project begin if approved by PoP and the City? K Once approved (which could be a 12-18 month process), site infrastructure work could begin within 6 months and building work could begin after that is completed.
- 5. Would Habitat be interested in building on the north property? K I do not know the answer to this. I think that Habitat would prefer the south property but would have interest in the north property.
- 6. What population will be served by any project? What is our target population? K If by population, is meant demographic we are talking about folks with household incomes between 5% of median income and 70% of median income (depending on the project).

- 7. What is in PoP control in any of these projects? K POP controls what projects get a go-ahead and where the project is built.
