- Year 3 (2026-2027) Grant allocation not to exceed \$10,000




Environmental Benefits

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Solar at Prince of Peace

- The net cost of the project after the first year is \$131,965, but Prince of Peace has received \$47,000 in dedicated funds for installing solar. These funds must be used for a solar project within 2 years, or they will be transferred to another institution that is installing solar. That means the net cost to Prince of Peace after the first year is projected to be \$84,965.
- The Internal rate of return without this gift is projected at 10.13% compared to about 5% for CDs. With the dedicated gift, the rate of return is significantly greater. This project made financial sense without this gift but is very compelling with the gift. The payback of PoP's investment is 7 years. The positive cash flow over 30 years is \$410,852.
- It should be noted that the project will shade part of the parking lot. This is a problem at night, so we are including lighting attached to the structure. It is hoped that with this additional lighting, the parking lot will have better lighting than it does now.
- There are two tax credits available to non-profits for a total of 40% of the cost of the project.

- With the project the electric bill/income will be based on Net-Metering. There is one meter that measures the electricity produced and one that measures the electricity consumed. PoP will either have a bill or get reimbursed based on usage and production.
- Following the installation of the solar panels the PoP parking lot will have the cracks filled, resealed, and restriped. The restriping will include van-accessible parking spaces.
